I HOPE EVERYONE READS THIS NEWSLETT IN A TIMELY FASHION. IF YOU DON'T, I HOPE YOU READ THE EMAIL THAT WILL SOON FOLLOW OR YOU MAY MISS AN OPPORTUNITY TO HAVE A VOTE ON SOME VERY IMPORTANT MATTERS.

I asked Jackie to hold off on printing the Newsletter because I needed more time to gather information to pass on to the general membership. As I

have said before, I listen to everyone and if they have legitimate concerns or interesting ideas, I try to set things into motion.

A couple of things have been brought to my attention, and as the saying goes, I hope to "kill two birds with one stone." The Milford Garden Club has apparently never had a consistent identifiable logo. Also, there is an interest in purchasing clothing and having it embroidered as well as having water bottles engraved.

An embroiderer was contacted and provided sage advice, but she declined to design the logo. She didn't feel qualified and suggested we hire an artist to create the design instead. Ideas were proposed to the artist along with historical references about the Milford Garden Club. The estimated cost of the custom embroidery designed by the artist was quoted at around \$100. The artist should have the design completed by the end of this week. The Board agreed it would be a worth while purchase.

It was also brought up at the Board Meeting to consider purchasing the design. The digital logo would them be used to print stationary, the Welcome Packet and an array of other items including water bottles. The rights to the digital copy would cost about \$200. This expenditure will come up for discussion and possibly a vote at the next general meeting.



Call to Order: 7:04 pm

Introduction of visitor and acknowledgement of new members.

President's Report by Susan Absher:

Susan discussed the material provided by WNF&GA with suggestions on how to attract new members. She also discussed the updated website and the need for members to submit photos to Sue Tompkins or let us know if they need their photo taken at a meeting so it can be added to the private section of the website. If a member does not want their photo included, they should let us know and we will indicted that their photo is not available.

VP of Publicity Report by Gail Cooper:

Gail asked members to provide photos and descriptions of projects such as, the clean-up at Arthur's Park and Heavenly Scent crafting project, so she can provide them to WNF&GA for inclusion in the next newsletter. The winter newsletter mentioned the Milford Garden Club 9 times which is a great improvement and hopefully we will improve on that recognition. Gail also updated her connections with local papers and was provided information on what the Spinal Column is now called and where copies can be obtained (a copy was provided to Gail compliments of Sue Grifor).

VP of Programs by Nancy Nordin:

Nancy discussed the spreadheet analysis of the history of presenters from the Clubs' inception (1948 to current). She provided the years when the Club's yearbooks were not found in the archives of files that had been stored. She also shared some interesting changes that have taken place over the years both with the type of programs presented and the expansion of interests and speakers. She also asked about certain events the club held such as the greens market and discussed the possibility of bringing some of these activities back. Nancy also asked for suggestions on next years speakers and offered suggestions for topics such as vertical gardening, invasive forest and garden pests, arts and crafts using repurposed items to create garden art, herbs and herbal products, native plants and an arborist. Suggestions are always welcome. She also addressed some concerns of overlaps in presentations for consecutive years and addressed concerns about Aprils speaker noting the difference in topic from the speaker from the March 10, 2022. Several members requested copies of the spreadsheet which will be provided.

Lisa also provided the dates for the Daffodil luncheon on Belle Isle and how to register, the WNF&GA Spring membership meeting which is being hosted by the Troy Club and held May 11th. Registration can be either done online or by mail. Lisa is also heading up the plant sale and provided sign-up sheets for various tasks preparing for the day of the plant sale.
- Garden Walk—Barbara Amey & Linda Becker, co-chairs for the Garden Walk provided an update and sign up sheets for volunteers to assist on each day of the walk.
- Welcome Packet Project—Diane Pearson presented the new Welcome Packet she has been working on
 which will be given to new members. She reviewed the process and polling she did in determining what
 should be included in the packet. She also provided an update on the timing for recipt of the new Club
 brochure. The members also discussed how to utilize the new brochure and contemplated asking certain
 downtown retailers to display a few brochures in their stores.

- Community Outreach Projects—Sue Grifor Sue discussed the Historical Society's Log Cabin Project, costs and how the Milford Garden Club might assist with restoring the garden which has fallen into disrepair. It is noted that there are some plants that are surviving but not thriving. Sue also discussed how we may be able to obtain a grant from the WNF&GA to use in the garden restoration.
